

# UK House of Commons Election Results at Candidate Level

## Abstract

This dataset contains candidate-level general election results for the UK House of Commons, spanning 49 elections held between 1832 and 2024. The results for elections between 1832 and 2019 were initially obtained from a now-defunct website, with corrections made using data from other sources. Users are encouraged to report any errors they identify in the dataset by contacting the author.

## Introduction

This dataset compiles candidate-level general election results for the UK House of Commons, covering 49 elections held between 1832 and 2024.

The results for the general elections between 1832 and 2019 were originally sourced from [electionhub.co.uk](http://electionhub.co.uk), a website that no longer exists. I have used additional data from the House of Commons, Wikipedia, and Eggers and Spirling (2014) to address a small number of errors in the original data.

The 2024 general election results come from the House of Commons, as reported by Cracknell and Baker (2024).
